

Sinovac inks agreement with Ministry of Public Health of Ecuador to build vaccine factory

Since the formal start of vaccine cooperation in April 2021, Sinovac has provided 16.2 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine to Ecuador , which represents 51% of all doses administered in the country



Sinovac Biotech, based in China, has signed a letter of agreement with the Ecuadorian Ministry of Public Health in Quito on an industrial unit for the manufacture of vaccines against COVID-19 and other diseases.

This is the first letter of agreement signed by Sinovac with the governmental authority of a country other than China, signaling a new stage in the company's global reach.

The Minister of Health of Ecuador, Dr. Ximena Garzón Villalba and Sinovac's Senior Director of International Business Tang Zijian signed the agreement on behalf of their respective organizations.

The vaccine factory will facilitate the transfer of relevant technologies between Ecuador and China and will improve the knowledge and skills of doctors in Ecuador.

In addition, medical scientists from both countries will be able to participate in collaborative research, as well as collectively accumulate knowledge and data, with the aim of improving the capacity to deal with epidemics and chronic diseases.
