McCord grants \$150,000 for cancer drug research



Singapore: McCord Research provided grants worth \$150,000 to Dr Tom Karagiannis and his team at the Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Institute in Melbourne, Australia, in order to study the effects of its patent-pending cancer drug Olivamine.
